2008 AUTOVANTAGE ROAD RAGE SURVEY

PITTSBURGH

- **MOST COURTEOUS** – Pittsburgh is the most courteous city in terms of road rage, compared to 24 other major American cities. Last year, Pittsburgh ranked No. 2. The top 10 best cities are:

- Miami was ranked as the least courteous city for the third consecutive year.
- **CUTTING OVER WITHOUT NOTICE** – Drivers in Pittsburgh are the least likely to observe other drivers cutting into their lane with little or no warning every day, at 28 percent. Miami is the most likely to observe this, at 66 percent.
- **DRIVING TOO CLOSE** – Pittsburgh drivers are the least likely to observe drivers who tailgate every day, at 39 percent. Drivers in New York are most likely to observe this, at 70 percent.
- **EATING AND DRINKING** – At 36 percent, Pittsburgh drivers are the least likely to observe other drivers eating or drinking while driving every day. Baltimore, New York and Tampa are tied as mostly likely observe this, at 57 percent.
- **MULTI-TASKING** – Pittsburgh drivers are the second mostly likely to admit multitasking (like putting on makeup, shaving or reading) while driving every day, at 4 percent. Last year, they were ranked as the fourth mostly likely to multi-task.
