2009 AUTOVANTAGE ROAD RAGE SURVEY

PHILADELPHIA

- **SEVENTH MOST COURTEOUS**—The City of Brotherly Love (tied with St. Louis) is the seventh most courteous city in the country in terms of road rage, compared to 24 other major American cities. Portland, Ore., ranked as the most courteous city. The top 10 best cities are:

#1	Portland, Ore.	#6	Washington, D.C.
#2	Cleveland	#7	Philadelphia (tie)
#3	Baltimore	#7	St. Louis (tie)
#4	Sacramento	#9	Boston
#5	Pittsburgh	#10	Seattle

- For the first time in four years, a new city claims the title as the worst in the U.S. for road rage; New York has unseated Miami as the least courteous.
- **CUTTING OVER**—Drivers in Philly (tied with Cleveland and Portland) are the least likely to observe other drivers cutting over with little or no warning/notice, at 29 percent. Miami is mostly likely to observe this behavior.
- **TAILGATING**—At 47 percent, Philadelphia drivers ranked No. 2 for least likely to observe other drivers following too close to another driver. Pittsburgh is least likely to observe this while Minneapolis is most likely.
- **MULTI-TASKING**—Despite its ranking, drivers in Philadelphia tied with those in New York and Phoenix for the No. 1 ranking for multi-tasking while driving (applying makeup, shaving, reading) on a daily basis.
